## Purpose and Emergency Context

When staying in place is no longer the safest option, whether due to property damage, evacuation orders, or worsening conditions, you may need to evacuate and implement your bug-out plan.

This checklist helps households track essential supplies, emergency contacts, medical information, and route details needed for a bug-out kit. Expiration dates for stored medications, food, and water are highlighted in red, making it easier to identify items that need to be replaced.

Proper preparation will not only reduce stress during an emergency but can also save your life and the lives of your family.

**Water:** Store one gallon per person per day for several days for drinking and sanitation; keep more when space permits.
